



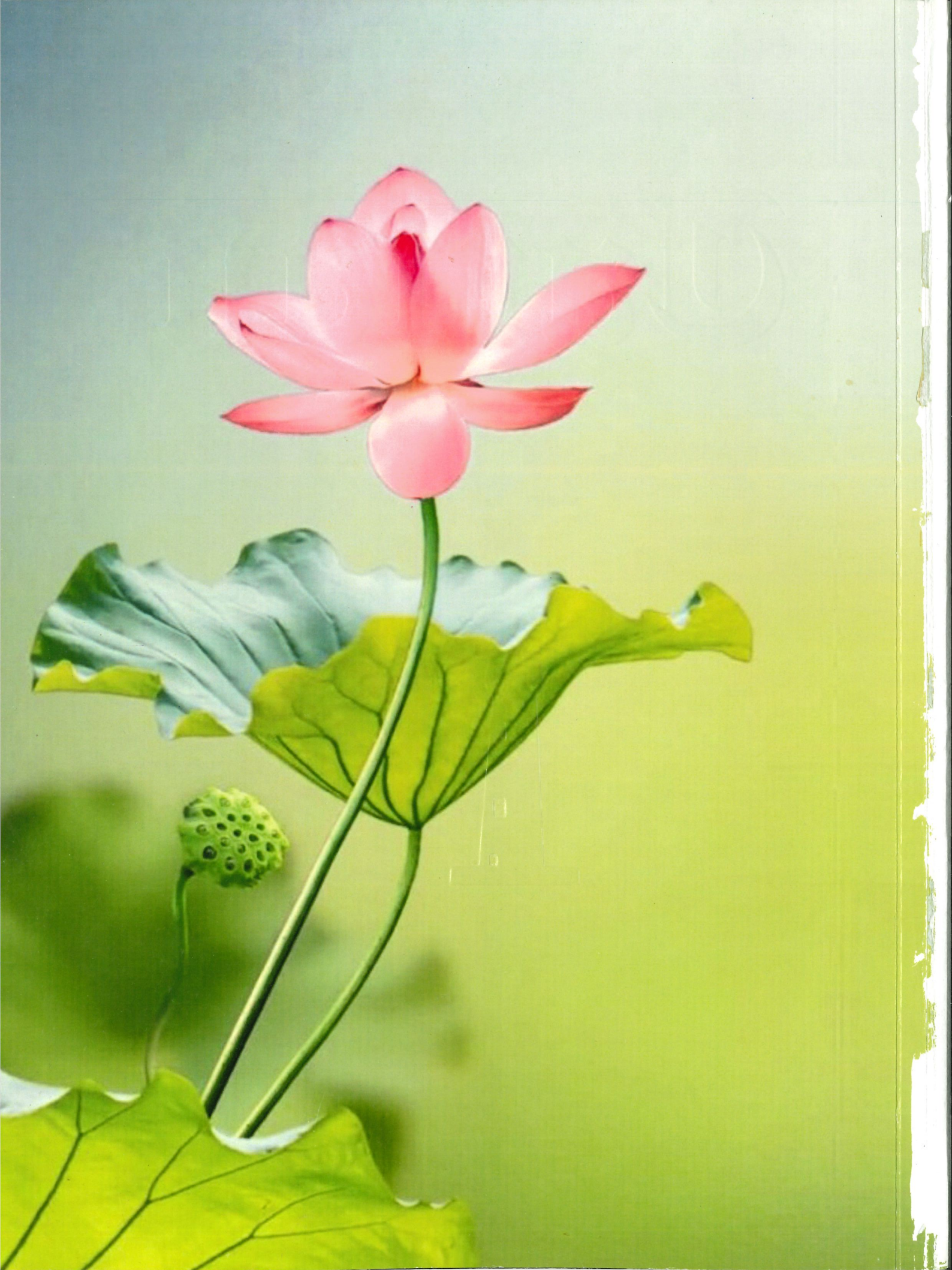

A Tartan Tale of Pore

Colourful Scottish Tartans are favourite designs in many countries. The tartan developed chiefly in the Highlands of Scotland. Scottish literature first referred to it way back in the thirteenth century and since then, the 'Tartan' has established itself as a beautiful and prestigious design.

The 'Tartan' design consists of stripes of various widths and colours. The stripes cross at right angles against a solid colour background, resulting in a pattern that is as distinguished as its historical significance, when each clan and family designed its own pattern.

Just like the 'Tartan' of long ago, our School magazine 'Tartan' encompasses glimpses of the manifold curricular and co-curricular activities of our School and the creative talents of our children who come from different cultural backgrounds that blend harmoniously to create the Bombay Scottish School Tartan.



THE SCHOOL SHIELD AND CREST

The School Shield represents the 'Cross of St. Andrew', the patron saint of Scotland. The white 'Crux Decussata' (cross) quarters the shield into four segments each representing a house denoted by Fluer – De – Lis, the Scottish Castle and the Lion and the Palm Tree.

OUR MOTTO

Perseverantia Et Fide in Deo. These Latin words mean 'Perseverance and Faith in God'. They are two qualities which personify the Scottish character. Bombay Scottish expects every Scottishite to do his duty and endeavour to achieve success in life by means of honest and strenuous effort, putting complete faith in God.

THE SCHOOL FLAG

The School flag is sky blue in colour. It bears the 'Crux Decussata' or the Cross of St. Andrew. Although never officially adopted, the St. Andrew Saltire (cross) became the emblem of Scotland and has been flown for hundreds of years. It was incorporated in the Union Jack that became the British National Flag after the union of England and Scotland in 1707. St. Andrew was a fisherman and brother of Simon Peter. At first, he was a disciple of John the Baptist. He brought to Jesus the boy from whose lunch the Lord produced enough to feed a crowd of five thousand. Jesus later made Andrew his first apostle and promised to make him a 'Fisher of Men'. Andrew was crucified on an X – shaped cross called the 'Crux Decussata'. He became the patron saint of Scotland as early as the eighth century.

St. Andrew's Feast Day is celebrated on 30th November. Funds collected on St. Andrew's Day were donated to the orphans of Bombay Scottish. These funds came from abroad. It is the sacred duty of every Scottishite to keep the flag flying high.

THE SCHOOL HOUSE SYSTEM

The House System was introduced in 1921. The Boy's Houses are named after Scottish Missionaries who were closely associated with the Orphanage; they include: Haddow, Kennedy, MacPherson and MacGregor. The Girl's Houses are named after the Scottish Queens: Anne, Victoria; Catherine and Elizabeth.

FLEUR DE LIS

This symbol is associated with scouting and guiding. It represents honour and duty, the qualities cherished by Boy Scouts and Girl Guides.

LION

From the Principal's Desk

"The intelligent man is one who has successfully fulfilled many accomplishments, and is yet willing to learn more." - Ed Parker.

Intelligence is derived from the Latin term, 'Intus Lego' which means 'to read inside me'. When Cicero (106-43 BC) coined this word, he meant to name the human capacity to *understand, comprehend and invent*. The words reason, intellect, understanding, thinking, judgement and knowledge are also used to define intelligence today.

The development of intelligence is seen in the usual categories of problem-solving, verbal ability, and the capacity to learn, analyse and synthesise, to name a few. That said, it is also seen in how they manage their feelings and emotions in a healthy way, understand how to make and keep friends and develop social skills. Children who develop their intellectual potential in all the above aspects, will become life-long learners, show higher maturity and be able to adapt well to new situations.

Humans have always shown a rich complexity of intelligence and while bringing up our children, we send them in its pursuit. We ensure that their milestones coincide with conventional levels, we allow interaction in the right social circles and we provide for a healthy body and mind. To guarantee the right stimulation and social environment, (regardless of gender), we send them to a good school and chart their course of higher education and career. In addition to these, we can also do the following:

1. Each child has at least one special aptitude or skill. Let's discover it and help it evolve. The world could do with more sportspersons, thinkers, musicians, dancers and dreamers!
2. A child may not know what he/she is capable of and that's why we must help them to explore the wide world of hobbies and interests. As they grow older, they will be grateful for this avocation.
3. Sometimes, a child may be willful in chasing after an idle task that may not be suitable for intellectual growth. Our supervision and guidance here are paramount, but we must do that with patience and love. Encourage positive behaviour always.
4. Putting undue pressure on your child to do tasks (or accomplish your goals) that he/she may not be suited or skilled for, will only frustrate the child. Work at their pace and support them as they struggle, so that they do not lose hope. They will grow up to be persevering and self-reliant.
5. Talking to them (and also listening!) about their feelings and opinions, and letting them learn empathy and the importance of emotional strength will add to his/her EQ.

Nelson Mandela said, 'A good head and a good heart are always a formidable combination'. Let us raise our children to be a formidable force for themselves!

NEW ACADEMIC YEAR: 2022 - 2023

2022-2023 has been a fruitful year. The students have been performing well throughout.

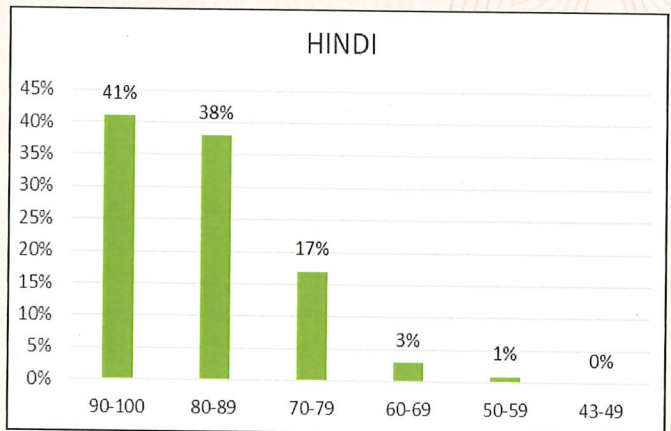
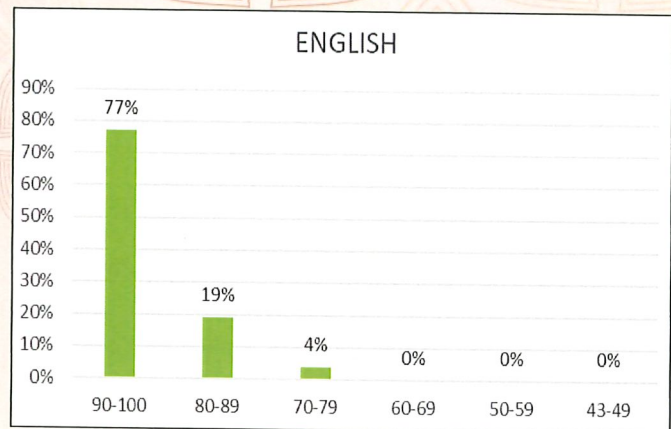
ICSE EXAMINATION 2022- 2023

Bombay Scottish School, Powai was selected amongst the **top eight from 530 schools across India and a grant of Rs 1,50,000/- was given to the school** for the implementation of the presented ideas.

BEYONDARIES: GLOBAL SCHOLARS (GRADES 7 & 8)

Global Scholars is a digital exchange program that connects students aged 10 to 13 years across cities around the world. Guided by the teachers, students participate in a project-based curriculum and engage with international peers in e-classroom discussion boards to learn how to solve a global problem. In 2022-23, our global scholars studied the importance of water in their lives, cities, and the world. They exchanged ideas and perspectives on discussion boards as they investigated some of the most pressing water security issues: water pollution, the impacts of climate change, and providing equitable access to safe water.

Throughout the year, students conferred on international platforms with their peers in e-classrooms, developing global and digital citizenship skills. They created videos to

introduce their class, school, cultures, and city, and shared what it means to be a Global Scholar. They learned the importance of safe water to individual and community health and calculated their water footprint to evaluate the impact of individual choices. They also conducted a school water audit and created a guide to share results and present solutions. Students analyzed how local waterways contribute to the economy, transportation, and cultures in their cities. They researched the impact of local water security issues, considered questions of equity, and discussed actions that could make their city more water-secure. They examined how climate change threatens water security and researched connections between water, people, and the environment to understand how protecting water can mitigate climate change and its effects.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

The working together of the School and the community of parents is crucial for the holistic success of students. The PTA, as always, is a crucial resource and ally in helping us achieve our goals in the year 2022-2023. Following are the highlights of their endeavours.

Administration:

- An increment of approximately 6% was given to PTA staff as part of the annual appraisal.
- In May 2023, an additional PTA manager was appointed to handle the increased scope of work.

Integrated Activities:

- These activities are overseen by the PTA.

Finance:

- The sweep in FDR Saving Plus Scheme was initiated by the PTA thereby maximising the earnings on the funds without compromising on the liquidity.
- The payment gateway for activities including Sports and Integrated Activities was initiated at Campus Care.

Events:

Transport:

- Regular bus facilities resumed in March 2022 post Covid with adherence to safety protocols.
- Monthly meetings were conducted with the Fleet Owners to ensure compliance with school norms.
- Meetings were held with all Bus Attendants to ensure conformity to codes of conduct, rules as well as appropriate mannerisms.
- The PTA organised a workshop on Safety and use of First Aid for the drivers of the School buses.
- Two in-person and two online meetings were held with eTrackingPro to address issues as well as plan for the coming quarter events.
- Parents were encouraged to use Emails (bsspowai.transport@gmail.com) as the primary source for complaint redressal (reason – governance, record keeping and tracking responses)
- School ID card issuance (For students who avail the bus service as well as for those who walk home)
- Post covid, in the year 2022-2023, our school received an overwhelming response from the parents and students for the various sports courses offered by the school.

Sports:

- A PTA Sports Team member (coordinator of each Sports activity) was assigned to be the single point of contact between coaches and parents whose children have enrolled for the various Sports activities.
- Individual Sports coordinators and the Sports Head monitored the sessions that were conducted on a regular basis.
- PTA Sports Team Members also accompanied the team, along with the coaches to these tournaments.
- A special selection process was conducted to form the Under 8 Football Team and the Under 9 Basketball Team.

These activities were conducted meticulously by the school.
